About us

Welcome to Porth Eryri Glamping, where luxury meets nature in Snowdonia (Eryri) National Park. We are a Welsh-speaking family, raising our four children in this beautiful part of North Wales. Nestled in a peaceful three-acre woodland, our site has four bespoke cabins.

Located 5 miles from Betws-y-Coed, we provide the ideal base for exploring Eryri and beyond. Experience the magic of the outdoors without sacrificing comfort at Porth Eryri Glamping.

Porth Eryri Glamping is a dream brought to life by us (Gethin and Teleri), a local couple rooted in Eryri (Snowdonia).
Raised in Pentrefoelas, just a stone's throw from our site, this land holds a special place in our hearts.

We run Porth Eryri Glamping on our 50-acre farm, on the edge of Eryri National Park, 5 miles from Betws-y-Coed. Our site features four private cabins nestled in a peaceful woodland, sharing this landscape in a way that honours its natural beauty.

We also manage Bocs Bwyd, a cosy café in Pentrefoelas village, just a mile from the cabins. It's a place where locals and visitors enjoy homemade food and a warm atmosphere.

We're raising our four children, with family at the heart of everything we do. We're passionate about providing a welcoming, authentic experience for our guests.

Welsh (Cymraeg) is our first language, spoken in our home and village. It's the language of our heritage, daily life, and community. We're proud to share this part of our culture with you during your stay at Porth Eryri Glamping. We look forward to welcoming you soon!





Arrival & Depature

Check in time is between 15:00 and 23:00. Please let us know if you are planning to arrive any later than 23:00. The key will be in the key-safe box at the entrance of the cabin. Code will be sent to you on the day of arrival.

Checking out time is 10.00am on the morning of departure.

Please leave the keys on your departure in the key safe box. We kindly ask that you complete some housekeeping on your departure by;

- * strip any bedding from beds and leave them, along with any used towels, on the floor in the bathroom.
- * empty the fridge and cupboards of all your food belongings and take them home with you or dispose of them in the bins provided.
- * empty the food waste bin and recycling bin and leave on top of the bins at the back of the cabin.

Check in 8 out

Check in time is between 15:00 and 23:00.

Checking out time is 10.00am on the morning of departure.

Directions

We are located just outside the village of Pentrefoelas, off the A5 trunk road. When approaching us from the East, drive along the A5 through the village of Pentrefoelas in the direction of Betws-y-Coed (do not turn into the village as some sat nav suggest). We are the first turning to your left off the A5 (turning directly opposite two houses over a bridge with green railings).

Arriving by Car

From Betws-y-Coed, West (5 miles away):

- Head out of Betws-y-Coed on the A5 road towards Pentrefoelas/Llagollen.
- Continue straight for about 5 miles.
- After coming through Padog, you will pass a right turn towards Ysbyty Ifan B4407
- We are the next right, a sharp, narrow turning on a long stretch, directly opposite two
- If you've reached the village of Pentrefoelas, you've gone too far.
- Follow the lane up over a stone bridge, and up into the woodland.
- Each cabin name is signposted.

From the A5, East:

- If you're travelling on the A5 towards Betws-y-Coed, we are the first left turn after you have left the village of Pentrefoelas.
- Turning is around I mile outside the village, a sharp left turn over a bridge, directly opposite two houses.
- Follow this lane up, over a stone bridge, and up into the woodland.
- Each cabin name is signposted.



Wood-Fired Hot Tub

The wood-fired hot tub is a private hot tub included in your stay. Guests will be required to fill and heat the hot tub themselves on arrival - we cannot offer a pre lit service due to other work commitments.

Please DO NOT light the fire until the hot tub is filled up with water, as this will cause severe damage to the tub. Equally, DO NOT drain the water out of the hot tub until the fire has completely gone out and is cold. If unsure, please leave the water in the hot tub on check out. IT IS VERY IMPORTANT YOU FOLLOW THIS RULE, AS NOT DOING SO WILL INCUR EXTREME DAMAGE TO THE TUB AND COSTS AT THE GUESTS' EXPENSE.



We want you to safely enjoy your hot tub use whilst staying with us. Hot tub safety includes the following:

- * Use safety straps on the lid when the hot tub is not in use. Keep the lid on when not in use to maintain water heat.
- * DO NOT light the fire in the hot tub until it has been filled with water, as this could damage the burner, and DO NOT drain the water whilst the fire is still lit.
- * Be aware that we use chlorine tablets in a dispenser to maintain the water, please leave this floating in the water at all times.
- * There is a thermometer floating in the water, optimum bathing temperature should be between 32-38°C. If the water gets too hot (above 38°C) you must get out of the hot tub and release some water out by opening the tap underneath the flue pipe and then topping it up with cold water from the horse pipe.
- * If the water temperature exceeds 38°C, you must stop loading the fire with wood and let the fire die down.
- * Hot tub is not suitable for children under 5 years old
- * Children must be accompanied by an adult
- * If you feel unwell be sure to leave the tub
- * Anyone with medical conditions should check safety first
- * Avoid drinking alcohol before/during use of tub
- * Use the gauntlets provided when adding wood to the wood burner
- * Check water temperature before getting in hot tub

Hot tub hygiene requires all users to have a shower before getting into the tub and to not add any products to the water. If the hot tub safety and hygiene advice is not followed, we may need to ask you to stop using the hot tub. We provide a good starter supply of wood but you may need to purchase more wood if you use it heavily (see wood supply section above).

We are happy to give you more guidance and detailed instructions on using the wood fired hot tub on arrival, please ask if you're unsure.



Firepit/BBQ & Pizza Oven

The firepit gives you flexibility to use as a cooking method or to sit around for warmth on summer evenings. Underneath the fire bowl is a warming oven which can be used for roasting and pizzas if you make a big fire.

BBQ - there is a removable swing arm bbq rack which swings over the fire to cook. It is advisable that you make a fire and allow the flames to die down before starting to cook to avoid burnin.

Pizza oven - Our wood-fired pizza dome oven is made from high quality, robust British steel, built to withstand the elements.

To light, simply pull the fire plate to the front of the oven and build up your fire as you would on a fire pit. Once burning nicely, load up with logs, push to the back of the oven and close the oven door. Our outdoor Dome Oven heats up quickly, and its fuel bank gives you plenty of time to cook pizzas!!

The outdoor oven is not just for pizza! Roast veg, bake fish, slow cook stews and flame grill steaks. Infuse large joints with smoky flavours and throw in some jacket potatoes. Use it to roast your side dishes and pop in your pudding. Possibilities are endless!

Air vents help you control the heat in the oven, reducing the air flow for slower longer bakes or open it up to reach temps of over 500°, easily monitored with an inbuilt thermometer. When all the hard work is done and the Dome Oven has cooled down, simply slide the fire plate out and clean out the ash.

Towel Rail

The bathroom towel rail is set on a timer setting. It comes on automatically for a period of time each morning, afternoon and evening.

Log Burner

The cabin has a cosy wood burning stove to heat the accommodation and keep it nice and cosy. Use the small twine and fire lighters provided to start each fire. Then maintain with the Hotmax log pellets provided or your own wood supply. Once you have established a good fire, you can close it down to maintain a good constant heat, by closing both latches at the bottom. DO NOT dry clothes in front of the log burner or leave anything on the top as this is a fire risk!!

Outside Lights

Please use the small remote control in the cabin to control the outside lights. Please do not switch the lights off in the plug - but if you do, we ask that you please switch them back before you leave.

Hot Water Bottles

If you are feeling a little chilly, there are cosy hot water bottles provided in the wardrobe. Please use these as you wish, but we ask that you empty them once finished.

Bedding/Towels

All bedding is provided, along with one bath towel and hand towel for each person staying. It would be very much appreciated if you could strip the bed at the end of your stay and place the used bedding/towels on the floor of the bathroom when you depart.



Wood supply

We provide a complementary starter pack of kindling, firelighters and wood for you to use during your stay. This will be more than enough for the first night or two, depending on how much you use the log burner/hot tub and firepit/bbq. Once this supply is finished, you will be required to purchase more at your own cost. There is a Shell garage (open 24 hours) and a Spar in Betws-y-Coed (5 miles).

Smoking

Smoking is strictly forbidden inside and outside of the property and on the grounds of our glamping site.

Bins

Please dispose of non-recyclable waste in the black wheelie bin at the back of the property. A recycling trolley is also located there; we ask that you use it appropriately. In Wales, recyclable material is split into 3 compartments: Top - paper and card, middle - plastic, cans, and cartons, bottom - glass. There is a food waste caddy under the sink for any leftovers. Please empty it into the small green food waste bin at the back on departure.

Property Parking

Please park at the rear of the cabin, or use the designated spaces provided as you enter the site.

- * Stop Tap / Fuse Box: The stop tap is located at the rear of the property. If there are any issues, please contact Teleri or Gethin.
- * Water Supply: Mains water.

Farm Safety:

* Porth Eryri Glamping is situated on a working farm. Please note that all buildings and fields outside the woodland are out of bounds due to the presence of machinery and livestock, which can be hazardous.

Electric Fence:

* Porth Eryri Glamping is situated on a working farm. Please note that all buildings and * A strand of electric fencing runs along the outside of the woodland area. For your safety, please do not touch or climb over this fence, as it can give an electric shock. outside the woodland are out of bounds due to the presence of machinery and livestock, which can be hazardous.

Inform guests that we do not allow car charging at our cabins as it is a fire risk and would go against our insurance policy. The nearest car charging point would be at;

- The magnificent local mountain ranges, including the Carneddau, Glyderau and Moelwynion, have attracted visitors to this area of north Wales for decades. Whether you are a seasoned rock climber or a novice rambler, there is adventure to be enjoyed for all in the local hills. Just remember to make sure that you are properly equipped.
- Yr Wyddfa (Snowdon) itself is a hugely popular destination and even offers an alternative route to the summit (the highest peak in England & Wales) via the mountain railway.
- In all there are 15 peaks within the Snowdonia range which stand at over 3,000 feet which provides a unique challenge to the more experienced rambler. There really is no better way to enjoy this area of outstanding natural beauty.

Lake & Rivers

- As well as its stunning mountain scenery, Snowdonia also boasts a multitude of beautiful lakes and rivers, providing opportunities for walking, watersports, fishing, and waterfalls!
- The popular lakes of Llyn Alwen and Llyn Brenig are very close to our base at Porth Eryri Glamping, while Llyn Tegid, in Bala, is Wales' largest natural lake and a short 20-minute drive away. The lake is popular for fishing, but also offers watersports like windsurfing, paddleboarding, and canoeing, while the National Whitewater Centre is on the outskirts of the town for those who enjoy watersports at a higher rate of knots!

 Brenig is also home to the Brenig
 Csprey Project, where you can
 witness these magnificent birds of
 prey in their natural habitat.


